

A brief History of Mulbarton Parish news (MPN)

Mulbarton was growing rapidly in the 1960s, with new housing between the Common and Cuckoofield Lane. Mulbarton's Rector, Sandy, the vicar, was concerned about the best way to welcome newcomers and help new clubs thrive. The only community spaces were the recently condemned Wingfield



Hall and the (old and overcrowded) school. Thus began Parish News, jointly between the Church, the Chapel and the Parish Council. Delivered free to every home by volunteers, there was an annual appeal for donations (in an envelope to Post Office or Church) and the cost was subsidised from a few ads and the Parish Council.

The first cover showed the church, but a competition was held in 1979 for a cover picture to reflect this being a VILLAGE and not a church magazine. The village sign remained on the cover until the end of 2017 when the magazine was no longer printed in the village and we went to full colour. There was one special cover, in Summer 1981, to celebrate floodlighting the church tower!

Inside, the order of items is still remarkably similar to the late 1960s: a letter from the Rector on page 3, register entries overleaf, and church services on the back cover; an item from the Parish Council chair, and from the Head Teacher. But we no longer have a Methodist Chapel and the organisations who report back have changed. In all the years of a B&W magazine there were only 2 printers, thanks to the Hutchins family and Brian Laws.

Despite moving to full colour, the magazine is now self-financing, thanks to many more advertisers. But it still depends on our wonderful band of volunteers delivering each quarter. Despite Facebook and websites, it continues to be THE means of informing you, our readers, of what is going on in the village to ensure that even the most recent newcomers feel welcome and can become involved in local life.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

We are very pleased with the resurfacing of the Common Car Park / entrance to the Village Hall. This will make it much safer for users of the Village Hall. Mulbarton Wanderers CIC, Scouts HQ, Orchard Park, MUGA, etc. The total cost of this work was £11.350 and has been paid by the Parish Council. South Norfolk Council and Mulbarton Wanderers CIC. We would like to sav a BIG thank you to all those involved in helping to achieve this.



The water supply to all allotments will be switched off at the end of October to minimise the risk of burst pipes. It will be switched on again in April. The council will use the winter months to assess the pipework in place and carry out some improvements.

Tree work at The Meadows and Orchard Park will be carried out in November, as recommended in the survey carried out earlier this year. We will review all

trees the council is responsible for again in the Spring.

We are meeting with suppliers to discuss some replacement play equipment for the Meadows. Many thanks to those who have already been in touch with ideas. Please keep sending these in so councilors can





understand the needs and preferences of the users (and their parents/carers). We hope to have the new equipment installed in the Spring, if we can secure some funding support.

Members of the public have asked us to keep benches & bins separate due to the smell! We will be moving these, where feasible, over the next few months. Please let the clerk know if we miss any.

Many thanks to our volunteer who has done an amazing job refurbishing and repairing the fingerposts on the Common.

This quarter the council have given Mulbarton Environmental Group (MEG) a grant of £756 towards maintenance of The Meadows Wood area. MEG have planted trees earlier this year with the support of Norfolk Wildlife Trust, Wood-land Trust, Parish and District Councils and many volunteers.



In September, the council agreed a new logo to help residents easily identify communications from the Parish Council. Many thanks to all those who helped create this and shared their views.



Pylons. This continues to cause concern to such an extent that Norfolk, Suffolk and Essex County Councils have all formally registered their misgivings about the social and environmental impact it will have throughout East Anglia. Sale of South Norfolk House. This has been deferred once again but an extraordinary Council meeting to discuss the sale is planned for 6th November. Hopefully this will be resolved in the near future.

MALGA. Ian Spratt has helped create logos for the Meadows for Mulbarton Group. The inspirational artwork was created by two pupils from Mulbarton Primary School following an art competition. The images can be seen in the September 23 issue of 'Mulbarton Environmental' the MALGA newsletter.

Alderman. South Norfolk Council have granted, Mulbarton's former and much-loved District Councillor, Vivienne Clifford-Jackson, Alderman status at a ceremony held prior to the full council meeting at the Horizon Building on 16th October.



Entrance upgrade to Community Hub. We are delighted to report that the much-needed repair to the Mulbarton Community Hub entrance has now been completed. This work has been achieved by a grant from South Norfolk Council and match funding by Mulbarton Parish Council.

Village Clusters. South Norfolk Council will be re-consulting on the housing allocations for the village clusters – probably starting before Christmas for an extended Eight-week period. New allocations are needed as one site in the district is inappropriate for development and another has reduced housing capacity. There could be implications for local villages.



As I write this article we are being bombarded by heavy rain and strong winds as storm Babete passes over The British Isles, a brutal reminder of winter to come.

After experiencing unseasonably high temperatures sunny days in September and the first half of October the sudden change is



Like ants, they all fly at the same time and their only mission is to mate and get into our houses to lurk in corners. Some traditions never change and I have chosen for the winter edition Diane Robinson's drawing of a winter robin on berries to remind us that the festive season is upon us.





Almond Loaf

Christmas food can be all about chocolate, dried fruit and indulgent eating but sometimes the simple things are best. This recipe will suit at any time of day and not just at Christmas. To turn it into a quick dessert, slice and serve warm with some berries and a dollop of crème fraiche.



150g marzipan
120g butter
50g caster sugar
80g plain flour
1 tsp vanilla or almond extract
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp ground cardamon
3 large eggs

- Set oven to 170c/150c Fan Gas 3 and line a 1lb loaf tin ready
- Break up the marzipan as small as possible and preferably whiz it in a processor
- Combine marzipan with butter, sugar and essence
- Mix together the flour, baking powder and cardamon
- Add one beaten egg at a time to the butter mixture along with a spoon of dried mix until all is well combined.
- Fill the loaf tin with the cake batter and bake for approx. 40-50mins or until cooked and lightly brown.
- Slice to serve warm or cool.
